Objective:	This is an introductory course into the area of macroeconomics. Macroeconomics involves an examination of the economy as a whole. In particular, we will exam how the whole economy behaves, how its sectors interact, and how monetary and fiscal policy can influence output, inflation, interest rates, unemployment, poverty, trade, debt, and other factors. There are three primary course objectives. First, to provide the student with the basic tools that allows them to reason like economists. Second, apply the economic tools to current news items. Third, to prepare students for more advanced courses in economics, finance, marketing and management.
